

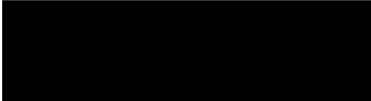

Dear Mr. Rimmel:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of July 9, 2020, for copies of information or records on a document titled, "Analysis and Assessment of Gateway Process," including page 25. Your request was received in our office on July 9, 2020.

To determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request, checks were made of all relevant U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command (INSCOM) holdings. These checks disclosed no Army intelligence investigative records pertaining to your request.

It should be noted that previous coordination with the INSCOM Historian's Office has determined that various historic records had been transferred to the Central Intelligence Agency, and no records copies were maintained with INSCOM. Therefore, we are unable to provide you with the missing page since we have no record copy.

This no record response is made on behalf of Major General Gary W. Johnston, Commanding, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the Freedom of Information Act and may be appealed to the Secretary of the Army. If you decide to appeal at this time, your appeal must be post marked no later than 90 calendar days from the date of our letter. After the 90-day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you from filing litigation in the courts. You should state the basis for your disagreement with the response and you should provide justification for an additional administrative search to be conducted or reconsideration of the denial. An appeal may not serve as a request for additional or new information. An appeal may only address information denied in this response. Your appeal is to be made to this office to the below listed address for forwarding, as appropriate, to the Secretary of the Army, Office of the General Counsel.
