Dear Davis Bommel,

This is in response to your letter postmarked April 13, 2019, received by this office April 30, 2019, in which you requested information. The Library of Congress, an agency in the Legislative Branch of the Federal Government, is not subject to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. §552). Nevertheless, the Library provides the fullest possible disclosure of its records under the policy on *Availability of Library of Congress Records*, 36 C.F.R. Section 703.

You requested every cataloging in publication (CIP) authority and bibliographic records for books published since 1900 in MARCXML format.

The information you requested is not in the Library's records. If the Library has this information it would be in the collections, which are accessed by a reference request, not a FOIA request. We suggest that you contact your library for assistance with your reference request, or contact the Library of Congress's Reference Department at the same address. Do not cite FOIA or 36 C.F.R. Section 703 in your reference request, or your request may be misrouted and/or denied.
